I have sat as a Director of the CMAA board since 2013. I grew up on a farm in southwestern Ontario where we raised cattle and grew oats, hay, wheat, corn and soybeans. Office Manager's Report

I hope this finds everyone doing well and I would like to wish everyone a Happy New Year. Calving season is well under way and everyone will be busy with that when you receive this magazine. Best of luck for this very demanding time of the year!

Membership: Memberships are now due. Annual membership \$100 (plus taxes), Junior membership \$15 (plus taxes). Please send payment to the office by credit card, cheque or e-transfer.

Calves 0-6 months: can be registered for only \$20. Don't delay sending applications to the office.

New Bylaw amendments, effective January 1st, 2019: At the 2018 Annual General Meeting the membership passed two bylaw amendments proposed by the board of directors.

c) bulls born on or after January 1, 2019 who are sired by registered CMAA Maine-Anjou sires must be sired verified by a CMAA approved genotype whose offspring could be registered.

Heidi Voegeli-Bleiker

d) bulls born on or after January 1, 2019 that are 50% or less that are not sired by a Maine-Anjou sire must be verified by the CMAA registered dam with an approved CMAA genotype whose offspring could be registered.

Walking Sires: All natural sires must have a DNA profile. Be sure to pull hair before turning bulls out! Mail DNA to the office and Heidi will send to the lab with appropriate forms.

Hair samples store indefinitely in paper envelopes, clearly identified, in a dry, dark place such as a filing cabinet. Consider pulling hair on every animal leaving the farm. Consider when sending a sample to the lab to keep half back in case of loss.

The Maine-Anjou registration work has been steady this past year adding several registrations with the amnesty program offered in the fall of 2018.

I would like to thank the membership for their continued support. I hope to see all of you at the Annual General Meeting this summer and keep your paperwork coming.
